

Double counting policy

The undergraduate students satisfying the following criteria may be granted permission to take up to three graduate courses (to fulfill their 400 level elective requirements) at undergraduate course prices to be counted towards their bachelor's degree. These graduate courses will be double-counted toward their master's degree. This allows students to earn both the bachelor's and the master's degrees in five years.

Criteria



Current enrollment in bachelor's degree in Computer Science and Computer Science / Mathematics at CSI and successful completion of three years of study with 90 or more earned credits



Cumulative GPA 3.3 or above



Two letters of recommendation, at least one from a fulltime CSI Computer Science faculty under whom the applicant has studied



Permissions from the course instructor, the coordinator of the graduate program, and the department chairperson



Application for admission and conditionally accepted to Computer Science graduate program



All graduate courses can be taken as double-counting courses, except CSC 716, CSC 727, CSC 740, CSC 770 (as they are required core courses)
